Here One Day — New and Pivotal Paintings from the past 35 years

This series of works tracks my growth as a painter from 1994 (Dornoch Terrace Verandah) to 2025 (Brisbane's Blooming Backyard). The city I call home is heading towards the Olympics and I am nostalgic before Brisbane's growth spurt.

After 28 solo exhibitions and contributing to 37 group shows, I wanted to share paintings I have set aside for safekeeping that preserve moments in time.

The building of the Eleanor Schonell Bridge pictures have never been exhibited and were painted over a period of 2 years, between the hours of 3pm and 6pm, so I could observe the best light.

After graduating from QUT's first Bachelor of Visual Arts degree in 1988, I was determined to keep painting — exploring relationships in colour and subject from my immediate environment. My teacher William Robinson said, "If you paint your life, you will never go wrong".

directly in front of the subject, for hours without photographic reference. So this is where the hours of my life have gone, recording the boom and bust of an Australian bouquet or the colours of the Byron sea and Tweed rivers.

The Still Life paintings are inspired by Manet's last flower paintings. A glorious group of works that guickly express the fleeting beauty of his friend's gardens. I created a wall of such paintings when visiting my 95 year old mother. In 2002, we travelled to Hill End NSW to begin my artist residency at Haefligers Cottage. We photographed portraits of trees and I vowed to do a series. For the first time, I allowed myself to work from these 23 years later as a way to connect with Mum. I have always loved Bonnard's and Van Gogh's Almond Trees and I yearned to paint my own.










